As spring warmed up into summer, we were able to meet more often in the parking lot at Meadowcreek High School, while still looking and praying for an indoor space we can lease or own that will accommodate the number of people we need seats for, breakout rooms for adult and kid classes, enough parking for ourselves and our guests, and a reasonable monthly cost—that's a lot to ask, but God can do more than we ask or imagine, so let's keep asking Him! In the meantime, we had to work around weather conditions and other factors, but here are some pictures of our last service in May and our first service in July (with apologies for the lack of pictures from our June 6th service, when our usual photographer was out of town; the other planned in-person service for June was rained out and replaced by meeting on Zoom instead).
